protecting you and your family

Pregnancy

GP

- Pertussis ('whooping cough' - you can have this >16 weeks pregnant)
- Respiratory syncytial virus ('RSV' - you can have this >28 weeks pregnant)
- Flu (at any stage of your pregnancy, throughout 'flu season' which usually runs September - March)
- COVID (if you have certain medical conditions - ask your GP)



Antenatal Clinic*

Newborn (up to 4 weeks)

Community clinic*



- Hepatitis B (given to baby after birth in hospital + 4 weeks old in a community clinic*, if mum is Hep B positive)
- BCG* (given to baby at 4 weeks old if they are at higher risk of tuberculosis, BCG is currently offered to those <16 years)

Hospital

Infant (up to 12 months)

- Diphtheria / Tetanus / Pertussis / Polio / Hib / Hep B (given at 8, 12 & 16 weeks)
- Meningitis B (given at 8 & 12 weeks)
- Rotavirus (given at 8 & 12 weeks)
- Pneumococcal (given at 16 weeks)



GP

Pre-school (1 - 4 years)

- Pneumococcal (given at 12-13 months)
- Meningitis B (given at 12-13 months)
- Measles / Mumps / Rubella / Varicella (MMRV given at 12-13 months and again either at 18 months OR at 3 years, 4 months dependent on your child's date of birth)
- Diphtheria / Tetanus / Pertussis / Polio (given at 18 months and / or 3 years, 4 months dependent on your child's date of birth)
- Flu (nasal spray - given to 2 & 3 year olds and those with certain medical conditions - ask your GP)
- For any vaccines that use porcine gelatine as a stabiliser; there are porcine-free alternatives - please speak to your GP.

School-age (4 - 16 years)

- Flu (nasal spray - offered every year during 'flu season')



School*

Adolescent (12 - 17 years)

- HPV (protecting against certain types of cancers - given at 12-13 years)
- Tetanus / Diphtheria / Polio (given at 14 years)
- MenACWY (given at 14 years)



School*

Adult (18 - 64 years)

- If you have certain medical conditions, you can have immunisations to better protect you, such as: flu, COVID, pneumococcal, shingles, MenB, MenACWY, Hep A or Hep B immunisations
- Please speak with your GP to see which immunisations you are eligible for



GP

Older adults (65+ years)

- Pneumococcal (given at 65+ years)
- Flu (given at 65+ years yearly during 'flu season')
- Shingles (given at 65 or 70-79 years, or at 18+ years if you have certain medical conditions)
- Respiratory syncytial virus ('RSV' given at 75 years)



GP

Recommended immunisations may change if you / your child is older than the recommended age - please check eligibility with your GP practice
